

**GUIDELINES FOR THE PRIORITIZATION OF RESUMPTION OF SUSPENDED
INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS PURSUANT TO REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11469 ALSO
KNOWN AS THE “BAYANIHAN TO HEAL AS ONE ACT”**

I. PURPOSE

To prescribe the criteria and procedures in the Prioritization of Resumption of Suspended Infrastructure Projects pursuant to Republic Act No. 11469 also known as the “Bayanihan to Heal as One Act”, and to ensure that infrastructure projects are effectively and efficiently implemented to contribute to the country's economic growth and people's livelihood as soon as funds become available.

II. COVERAGE

These guidelines shall be applicable to previously approved projects by the TIEZA Board of Directors, but were suspended due to the “Bayanihan to Heal as One Act” in response to the COVID – 19 pandemic. Resumption shall be subject to availability of funds.

III. CRITERIA

1. Projects shall be clustered based on the readiness of the project for procurement

Projects shall be evaluated based on the completeness of documents and readiness of the project for implementation. Documents include Detailed Engineering Design (DED) and other Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) requirements.

Priority 1.	Projects already in procurement process
Priority 2.	Projects endorsed to BAC
Priority 3.	Projects with DED approved by the COO
Priority 4.	Projects with DED for approval by the COO
Priority 5.	Projects with ongoing preparation of DED

2. Projects in each cluster shall be ranked using the following criteria:

2.1 Alignment to Tourism Response and Recovery Program (TRRP) of the Department of Tourism (DOT) to mitigate the impact of pandemic - 50%


- a. Infrastructure project that will address the "new normal" post COVID19 pandemic such as mandatory provision of facilities for sanitization with personal protective equipment
- b. Facilities geared towards Disaster Risk Reduction Management plans.
- c. Facilities that will promote sustainable development such as Water Supply, Waste Treatment Facility, Sanitation infrastructure, etc.
- d. Development of health and wellness facilities/hospitals for public use including tourists

2.2 Conformity with DOT and TIEZA plans and programs – 50%

- a. TIEZA mandate - Cultural, Historical, Religious, and Heritage Sites or Ecotourism Sites in depressed provinces with strong tourism potential - 50%
- b. Support facilities along completed tourism road projects under the Tourism Road Infrastructure Project Prioritization Criteria (TRIPPC) – 40%
- c. Included in the Tourism Development Area (TDA) of National Tourism Development Plan (NTDP) – 30%

These guidelines shall take effect immediately upon approval by the TIEZA Board.


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
